# "We Support Those Who Serve"



This year marks the 90th anniversary of the end of the First World War. also called "The Great War" and "The War to End All Wars." Sadly, the world has not learned the lessons history, so we are, as George Santana said, doomed to repeat them.

Our nation and our allies have

not been able to collect on the *peace dividend* that so many looked forward to at the end of the Cold War. Our military is again engaged in a conflict with an adversary that sheltered *al Qaeda*, the terrorist organization that toppled the twin towers of New York's World Trade Centre, damaged the Pentagon, and brought down United Airlines Flight 93.

Those who perpetrated the events of Sept. 11, 2001, not only failed to understand the lessons of history, they miscalculated the response of the United States, and the reactions of the members of the North Atlantic

Treaty Organization. In addition to the European allies, Canada is engaged in the pacification of Afghanistan and our troops stand shoulder-to-shoulder with the United States and the United Kingdom in southern Afghanistan.

As I write this, Nova Scotia's flag has flown at half-mast ten times, once for each Nova Scotian who has given his life in Canada's mission in Afghanistan. This is the same terrible, but necessary, sacrifice which our families, friends,

and neighbours have paid in previous conflicts.

During the First World War, the Royal Canadian Navy's White Ensign flew from our young Navy, only four years old in 1914, as her ships patrolled the Atlantic and Pacific coasts. In a little more than one year, our Navy will celebrate its Centennial.


In the war that ended 90 years ago, soldiers of Nova Scotia's famous regiments fought against their adversaries - the 85<sup>th</sup> Nova Scotia Highlanders marched behind the artillery screen as they advanced on the German trenches in April 1917. Seven months later, in Passchendale, the 85<sup>th</sup> went into battle again, and when the postbattle roll was called, only 65 remained standing.

The Halifax Rifles carry the First World War battle honours of the Somme, Arras, Ypres, to mention only several. The unit was removed from service and placed on the Supplementary Order of Battle in the 1960s, but on September 8<sup>th</sup>, Minister of National Defence Peter MacKay announced that The Halifax Rifles would return to service as a 100-member unit with 36 Canadian Brigade Group.

And while the Royal Canadian Air Force didn't come into existence until after the First World War, our young aviation enthusiasts joined the

Royal Flying Corps and the Royal Naval Air Service.

Our military members serving in Afghanistan are keeping faith with those who have gone before them. They are engaging our adversaries there so that they



won't engage us here.

Please allow us to join with you in showing our support for them during their deployment, and a warm welcome of appreciation when our modern heros and new veterans come home.





# Celebrating 250 Years of Parliamentary Democracy


Welcome to Democracy 250.

This website has been created to share information on this year's celebrations marking the 250th anniversary of the birth of parliamentary democracy in Canada; a proud first for Nova Scotia.



**WWII** 

Russell was born in 1915 in Glace Bay, NS. He joined the Merchant Navy in 1940 and signed on with the British Ship S.S. A Leborgne on November 22 of that year as part of a convoy from Sydney, NS. Russell was killed by an enemy air raid on December 21, 1940. He was the only man to be killed from the entire crew. His daughter, Joan Spurr, is a 20-year member of Middleton Branch 001 of The Royal Canadian Legion.




# ANDERSON, Martin Joseph

During the Battle of Monte Cassino, the tank Norman was driving was hit, causing him to lose part of his skull and his left eye. On September 12, 1945, he was discharged from the service as "unable to meet the required military physical standards." He was awarded the following medals: Defence of England, 1939-1945 Star, Italian Star, France & Germany Star, CVSM, and the Holland Medal. Norman resides in Truro, NS.

Simeon lived in Martin's Point, NS, until his death. He served with the Merchant Marine in the North Atlantic from 1940-1944.



His Discharge Certificate states that he served with the 116<sup>th</sup> Canadian Infantry Battalion in England and France, and that he was awarded the Military Medal, the War Medal, and the Victory Medal. At the time of his death in 1980, Victor was a member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 488 in BrechinMara in Brechin, Ontario.




# BELLIVEAU, Joseph Norman



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

He served on HMS Orion until June 1944, where he took part in landings in North Africa, Sicily, Salerno, Anzio and D-Day. In 1953, he transferred to the R.C.N. Ken was awarded the 1935-1945 Star, Atlantic Star, Africa Star, Africa Clasp, France & Germany Clasp, Italy Star, War Medal Long Service, Good Conduct Medal, Canadian Forces Decoration, and Centennial Medal. Following his thirty-five years of military service, Ken had a second career in the Dartmouth School System as a music teacher before finally retiring in 1986.

He started a second career following retirement, being employed with Canada Post in Middleton, NS, where he made his home with wife, Doris. Tom served for a number of years as President of the Enfield Branch and later became a member of Middleton Branch 001 of The Royal Canadian Legion. Tom passed away in 1994.

# BLYNN, Arnold

WWII

Arnold was born at Plympton, NS, on April 24, 1918. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Firce on July 25, 1939 and served as a pilot overseas. In August 1944, while piloting a R.A.F. bomber on a mission to drop supplies to Polish resistance, his aircraft was shot down by the Nazis. The wreckage was not recovered until 2007, when a burial service was held for Arnold and his crew at Poland's Rakowicki Cemetery in Krakow. Arnold was posthumously awarded the Polish Home Army Cross, the highest award for bravery in the struggle to liberate Poland, as well as the R.C.A.F. Operational Wing in recognition of gallant service.

Wallace was born on April 17, 1898 in Great Village, NS. He joined the Canadian Overseas Expeditionary Force on March 25, 1916 at Truro, NS. He served in Canada, Britain and France and was awarded the British War Medal and Victory Medal. At twenty years of age, he was killed in action on September 2, 1918 in France while serving with the 4<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Canadian Machine Gun Corps. Having no known grave, his name is commemorated on the Vimy Memorial, Pas de Calais, France.

# **BOWLBY**, Arthur

WWII

Art was born in Middleton, NS, in 1924. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force, even though he was under-age in 1941. He served as a Wireless Air Gunner in England and Europe. He was shot down over Belgium, rescued by the Belgium underground and smuggled to Spain. He eventually made it back to England. He returned home and was released in 1946. He later re-enlisted in the R.C.A.F. and served in Canada, France and Germany and retired in 1970 as a Captain. Art's date of death is unknown.

# **BOYCE**, Charles Hilton

Charles was born in Amherst, NS, in 1895, the son of Ernest and Flora Boyce. He enlisted in the Army in 1916 and went overseas. He liked horses so he was posted to # 10 CRTC. He was then transferred to 150<sup>th</sup> Battalion with Mule Trains, hauling ammo to the front. He was discharged in 1919. Charles passed away in 1992.

# **BOYCE**, Ernest Edward Elliott

WWI

Ernest was born on December 15, 1868, in Sackville, NB. On September 16, 1915, he joined the Active Militia No. 8 Canadian Army Service Corp. He was promoted to Sergeant on December 1, 1915 and was put in charge of the Quarter Master's Store. On November 18, 1918, he joined the Canadian Overseas Expeditionary Force and found himself in charge of a prisoner of war camp near Amherst. He was discharged from the service by reason of Demobilization on April 25, 1919 at Halifax, NS. Ernest passed away at the Colchester Regional Hospital on November 4, 1956 and is buried in the Robie Street Cemetery.

# BOYCE, William E.

WWII

William was born in Amherst, NS, on May 30, 1925. He served in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion (NPAM) from May 3, 1942 to June 8, 1943. He joined the Army on June 17, 1943 and embarked for overseas on July 12, 1944, joining the Fort Gary Horse as a tank driver. He returned to Canada on January 20, 1946 and received his discharge on February 26 of that year. From July 10, 1952 to December 1, 1959, he attained the Rank of Warrant Officer 2 in charge of stores for 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion NS Highlanders.
