Constructed in Oct./Nov., 1937 in memory of the fallen W.W.I. veterans.

The World War One Cenotaph in Antigonish is located at the Federal Building Grounds, Main St. It was previously located at the intersection of St. Ninian St. and Main St., West end of town (see story regarding the move on p.213). It was built on the above location in October/November of 1937 and was unveiled on November 11, 1937.

The material used in its construction was a North Grant (Antigonish County) sandstone. It is a plain obelisk, 17 feet high, tapering to a pointed cap, designed and completed by F.W. Arsenault. The concrete base was put in and donated by the MacDonald Construction Company, Halifax, N.S. On three sides of the monument are black granite slabs on which the names of the dead were carved by W.T. Dalton, Shelburne. On the North side is an inscription composed by Miss K.M. MacDonald, Teacher in England at Morrison High School (1937).

It was the people of Antigonish and surrounding areas that donated to the fund toward the building of the Cenotaph in the town of Antigonish.

Until the Allies won the war


He would then go home victorious And live a long happy life

But now it's our turn to serve and protect.



#### The Lucky Ones

My entire life, I've been told I'm lucky. Lucky to have grown up in a loving household, lucky to have carried a Ross Rifle that didn't jam up in the muddy trenches, and lucky to have survived the War. I guess I am lucky, if lucky means forced to bear the guilt of taking dozens of lives. I am lucky, if lucky means unable to sleep because every time I close my eyes I'm transported back to that battlefield. So yeah, I guess I'm lucky.

During my deployment at Vimy, I saw horrors I pray to forget. The problem is, I can't forget. I can't forget the faces of the soldiers I fatally shot. I can't forget the mutilated bodies of my friends lying on the battlefield. I can't forget what I've done. Some days, I find myself unable to feel and in these periods of numbness, I can't feel sorrow, fear, or despair. Other days an influx of these terrible feelings returns and I'm forced to relive my time in Vimy over and over in a vicious, unforgiving cycle.

At the time of the War, I was diagnosed with shell shock. Not even medical experts understood that wounds weren't just physical, nor did they understand how to treat shell shock. They brushed this condition off, perhaps treated by shock therapy or, if you were lucky, the less barbaric treatment of talk and physical therapy. However, these treatments were simply to get soldiers back on the front lines and didn't have a goal of long-term rehabilitation in mind. Men who were emotionally distressed to the point of being unable to walk, speak or function, including me, were deemed cowards or insane. We weren't cowards, nor insane, we were victims.

When I arrived back home, a small part of me believed I was still back in those vile trenches. The War had been over for years, but I was not done fighting. I couldn't sleep. I'd often wake up, teary-eyed, confusing my bedroom for a battlefield and my wife for an enemy soldier. Eventually, I was diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder and began therapy. Talking about my experiences at Vimy helped me immensely on my long road to recovery. Seventy-two years after Canada claimed Vimy Ridge, my battle was finally over. I died a proud Canadian veteran in recovery of PTSD. I was survived by my beautiful wife who stood by my side despite the hardships we've faced. Without her, my lifeline, I probably would've faced a more gruesome end.

My entire life, I've been told I'm lucky. At first, I didn't realize it, but now I do. I am lucky. I am lucky I sought help for my PTSD. I am lucky I had a loving wife who supported my recovery. I am lucky that I didn't have to fight this battle alone. I am one of the lucky ones.

In Canada, approximately 10% of all war-zone veterans experience PTSD. An even smaller fraction of these veterans have a similar, happy ending. Too many veterans have met tragic ends because their PTSD remained undiagnosed or they did not seek treatment. Especially during these unprecedented times, it is important to reach out for help. The COVID-19 pandemic has been hard on everyone, but is notably harder for veterans suffering from PTSD. This pandemic creates more stress and PTSD triggers. The sailing was in March, and was very rough, causing many to be seasick including Evely and her 5 month old son. Upon arrival in Halifax N.S. they were checked out by doctors. Once cleared they were allowed to take a train to Moncton N.B., where they were reunited with John. Then they travelled to Sussex N.B. to meet John's family.

In conclusion the next Remembrance Day try to remember John and Evelyn Walker, a bomber who didn't just want stamps.

# Joseph "Alcide" LeBlanc

101 year old veteran Joseph "Alcide" LeBlanc: The Longest Serving Yarmouth Gunner (Ret'd)

World War II veteran Joseph "Alcide" LeBlanc and Royal Canadian Legion Branch 155 Wedgeport, NS member was presented with a Regimental (artillery) Scroll making him the Longest Serving Yarmouth NS Gunner (Ret'd). Mr. LeBlanc was awarded this title by the Yarmouth 84th

Independent Field Battery Royal Canadian Artillery on his 101 birthday March 21, 2021. Photo shows Mr. LeBlanc at Veterans Place holding the scroll with a Royal Regiment coin in the corner.

Mr. LeBlanc was a 25 pounder artillery gunner in the 4<sup>th</sup> Field Regiment of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Division, Canadian Army. He landed in Normandy, France shortly after D-Day. He and his unit fought heavily for three weeks against the Germans in Caen, Normandy, which was 70% destroyed. He was also a batman to the Captain who decided where the artillery should be aimed. Two previous drivers and a Captain were killed. He fought against the Germans for over 11 months from Normandy to near Berlin where he was on May 8, 1945, the Victory in Europe Day. He also served as a peacekeeper for three months in Germany.

In 2014 he received the French Medal of Honour that was instituted in 1802 by Napoleon Bonaparte to thank his best soldiers. He also received the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the liberation of Normandy medal. He was born in Wedgeport, NS. Joseph "Alcide" LeBlanc passed away in Yarmouth on September 3, 2021.



# Addison "Wesley" Spinney

Addison "Wesley" Spinney was born in 1923 in Pubnico Head, Yarmouth County. He served during WWII as Quartermaster aboard the destroyer HMCS Qu'Appelle which fought on D-Day June 6, 1944 and subsequent weeks. He also served on a corvette, the HMCS Kamloops, that was a convoy escorting ship from Canada to the United Kingdom. He said that they were shot at from under the sea, from the sky and from enemy ships. He remembered vividly plucking casualties out of the water and at times during a battle they could not stop. He said they had to steam through them and could hear them hollering. He came out of the war without a scratch but with a lot of bad memories that were with him until his death.

Upon his return to civilian life, he continued his military interests by serving 18 years with the 14<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery and as an instructor for 33 years with the 110 Yarmouth Army cadets sponsored by the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 155 Wedgeport NS of which he was a most faithful member always attending meetings and legion events.

In 2014 he received the French Medal of Honour that was instituted in 1802 by Napoleon Bonaparte to thank his best soldiers. He also received the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the liberation of Normandy medal. He died at age 97 on December 4, 2020.

#### LCol Howie Allen Biography

Born in North Sydney, Nova Scotia on June 5th 1944. At age seventeen, Howie was looking for adventure; he wanted to do something different so he decided to enlist into the 2nd Battalion NSH (CB) Militia at Kelly's Beach in North Sydney. In September of 1961 Howie began his basic training at Victoria Park in Sydney as a Private recruit. During a demolition training course in Gagetown he recalls his first time using C4 explosives. The officer demonstrated first with a pound of explosives, and it made quite a bang. He then took everyone into a classroom with C4 sitting on a table, the officer was smoking and left his cigarette burn on the pile of plastic explosives and left the room. No one in the room knew what to do; they wouldn't dare get out of their seats. At the time most did not know that it would not explode without the correct detonator.

When asked about memorable moments, the first thing to come to mind for Howie is the trooping of the colours in 1967. This was the centennial year for Canada. The camaraderie with fellow soldiers and just jumping in a Hercules to go to

Gagetown are all memories he will enjoy. The Camaraderie is what Howie loves about the military, there is no prejudice, and everyone is in it together. It didn't matter who you were outside the military, when you put on the uniform, you are respected as a soldier. Respect is important because not only do you rely on them but they also rely on you. If you can accomplish this any task can be completed.

Howie has very few negative memories of his time in service; sure he missed out on many long weekends with his family. There is only one thing Howie would do differently, back in 1961 when he joined the army as a reservist, he wishes he joined regular forces. He believes it is a great career, one that you can be proud of, while serving your country. "Everyone can use some military experience - it definitely shows up and can help you deal with life outside of the military." Howies two proudest moments remain taking over command of the Battalion in October of 1989 and in 1990 when he commanded the first Total Force Infantry Battalion exercise in Gagetown. Howie gave up command of the battalion on October 4th 1992 and stayed on as Regimental Secretary for one more year before retiring from the military. Howie resides with his wife Judy in North Sydney.

L Col. Michael Alteen was born in Sydney, Nova Scotia on September 26th 1947. He grew up in Sydney and attended Riverview Rural High School and Sydney Academy. In 1966, at the age of 18, Michael enlisted in the Army. He did so in Sydney and was posted to Kingston, Ontario for basic training. He began his military career as a signalman in the Royal Canadian Corp of Signals. Joining the military really seemed like something he wanted to do. For his first two years of service, between 1966 and 1968, he was a part of the regular forces. After this he took a hiatus from the military to become involved in the family business as a jeweller with Alteen's Jewellers. By 1980 Michael had reconvened his military career with the 2nd Bn. Nova Scotia Highlanders (Cape Breton) as an Officer Cadet, training in Aldershot, Nova Scotia, Gagetown, New Brunswick also Orangeville, Borden, and Petawawa, Ontario.

Especially as you move forward with your career and climb through the ranks; tasks and responsibility grows. Whenever you are met with adversity, fight through, hold your own and you will prevail. Michaels' overall experience has been very positive.

## Private John Francis Arsenault



#### Pte John Francis Arsenault Biography

John Francis Arsenault was born in Alder Point on January 17th 1922. He enlisted into the Army at the Town Hall in Sydney Mines, Nova Scotia in April of 1941. He was a trooper with the Royal Canadian Dragoons; he completed his basic training in New Glasgow before being shipped to Camp Borden for the Armored Vehicle course. He decided to enlist because at the time he was working in the Toronto Mine and he figured if he was going to die, he was going to do it fighting for his country. Once his training was completed he was shipped to England, where he arrived in October of 1941. It was not until December of 1943 that he was moved out of England. He boarded the troopship, S.S. Alexandria, in Loch Lomond, Scotland. The convoy of ships he was a part of was bombed while traveling through the Strait of Gibraltar. He recalls everyone being out on deck enjoying a beautiful evening, when the sirens sounded people began rushing below like cattle. Two ships sank in the strait, the S.S. Monterrey picked up the survivors out of the water. From Italy he moved on through to France, Belgium, Holland and on to Germany. Throughout this time he was a dispatch rider. John remembers many bad experiences during his

time serving overseas. It is never easy to lose comrades. He recalls one incident which occurred just four days before the war had ended. A car traveling just ahead of him was hit by a magnetic mine; everyone in the vehicle was lost. John was lucky to escape with only a few injuries which could heal with time. John would like to think of the more memorable experiences he has had, during his time on rest leaves he was able to travel and see some wonderful places. One of his favorites was going to see the ruins of Pompeii.

John's proudest moment during his service was having the opportunity to be part of King George VI escort into Aldershot, England on his motorcycle. As part of the escort John was dressed with his high boots and white helmet for the royal touch. The king was coming in for an inspection of the troops. After the war had ended John stayed in Germany as part of the occupation for four months. After this time he got his discharge from the army and returned home.

Upon returning to Canada he immediately re-entered the work force, working in the mines for two years before starting a career with CN and Marine Atlantic as a statistics clerk until his retirement in October of 1985. He now resides in Sydney Mines, Nova Scotia with his wife Rosina, the couple has four children.

After the war, Guy returned to a hero's welcome in Sydney Mines. Hundreds of people turned out to watch as he was paraded through town in a dump truck. In 1946, he married his wife, Jesse, and they subsequently had seven children. He worked "in the pit" for a while and also drove an ambulance. Later, he worked at the Liquor Store until his retirement. Additionally, after the war, Guy was also involved in the training of soldiers in the local militia. Guy is Lifetime Member of Br. 008 Sydney Mines, Royal Canadian Legion.

#### Guy Bailey Biography

Guy Bailey was born November 14, 1920. Guy joined up with the 36th Battery of Sydney Mines prior to the outbreak of World War 2. When hostilities commenced he already held the rank of Sergeant and was immediately called upon. As a Counter Battery Staff Officer in the Royal Canadian Artillery, Guy served in Sicily, Italy, France, Holland, and Germany. Among the actions he participated in were the Sicily and Normandy invasions and the liberation of Holland. On one occasion he narrowly escaped when he was strafed by a German plane while driving a transport. Guy sometimes had the grisly task of burying fallen comrades but he also had fond stories of "sports day" when he practiced his boxing skills.





#### PO 1 Dean Baldwin Biography

Dean Baldwin was born in Chatham, Ontario in January 1962. Growing up on Lake Erie, the water became very natural to Dean, so when the time came to choose a career it only made sense to pursue one on the water. When he was 19 years old, Dean enlisted into the Navy in Windsor, Ontario. He took part in basic training at CFB Cornwallis in Deep Brook, Nova Scotia. After basic training, Dean began his career on the water. He has travelled all over the world taking in cultures and climates from many diverse countries. He spent his first six years serving on the HMCS Assiniboine, after this he spent two years on a shore posting at the Canadian Forces Fleet School. Here, was the Acoustic Data Analysis Center. He spent this time analyzing and teaching sonar men how to decipher acoustic data. After his onshore posting he was back on the water. some other ships he spent time working on are the HMCS Nipigon, Margaree, Saguenay, Halifax, St. John's, and Athabaskan. During this time he served as the Anti-Submarine Warfare Director, under this title Dean controlled all underwater

weapons and sensors, conducting exercises in charge of ships, aircrafts, helicopters and all man power on board. Completion of his ASWD course and his very first exercise at sea as the ASWD remain two of his proudest moments of service. Another proud accomplishment is representing Nova Scotia in the Military Sports Awards for sailing at the National level. He also included firing his first torpedo, at one time having the longest active sonar contact on a Submarine at 53,000 yards and retirement as memorable

When asked about any memorable stories from his time in service Dean recalls one particularly rough day in the North Atlantic, with swells up to forty feet tall. A rouge wave had hit his ship and HQ1 reported a final heeling angle of 51 degrees. "Imagine a 300' warship heeling over at that angle." As for his worst experiences, Dean lists the Swiss Air Disaster, undoubtedly.

Dean says his military career has been nothing short of amazing. While at sea he did miss his family, his wife Joanne and children Spencer and Samantha. Upon retirement and looking back, one thing Dean misses is laying in his bunk nearest to the ship walls and having the steady flow of water rushing by as he lays in bed.

## Private George Bidart




#### Pte George Bidart Biography


George Bidart was born in North Sydney, Nova Scotia on April 26th 1919. He enlisted into the Army at Victoria Park as soon as he finished High School. George completed his basic training in Aldershot, Nova Scotia. He says he joined because if he didn't, there would have been conscription anyways. Before enlisting he worked for a short time at the Sydney Steel Plant. At the end of basic training George boarded the Queen Elizabeth to make the jump across the Atlantic. His first stop was England. While he was in England he worked as a cook for the officers. Once in England training continued until he was moved to Italy where he spent the better part of the war.

George remembers facing perils at sea, before he even arrived in Italy. Many precautions were taken to ensure the safe arrival of soldiers. Soldiers were taken to the depot in Italy where they were trained to learn the Italian landscape. By the end of their training, George's ankles had swollen so bad the doctors kept him back from the front lines. George wanted to work so he asked officers what he could do; he was sent to HQ and landed a job in the mail room. He would take mail by Jeep or motorcycle to the soldiers at the front lines.

George considers himself lucky to work with the people he has during his time enlisted. When he returned home one major adjustment he says he had to make was to get used to the Canadian food again. On his return home he received his discharge from the military and applied to school. George took Engineering for three years before he began working at the steel plant, where he worked for fifty years leading up to his retirement. George's proudest moments of service are boarding the Queen Elizabeth to travel overseas for his country and the training he has completed. When asked if he had any advice for the young men and women currently serving our country, George says "Let us hope there is no more war." Soldiers receive excellent training but from his experiences he says, it's "stuff you have to encounter to know what you would do. If there is another war, take your time and think twice." For George the hardest part was learning to cope, when you are forced to fight and see the fighting, you must learn to cope - and learn fast. George married Penny MacDonald with whom he had two children. He now resides in the Veterans Wing in Harbourview Hospital in Sydney Mines, Nova Scotia. George appreciates the care he receives from the staff and realizes how lucky they are to have these services











## Mel Birmingham



#### Mel Birmingham Biography

Mel Birmingham was born December 31, 1942. Mel joined the Reserves with the Nova Scotia Highlanders 2nd Battalion in 1958. In 1962 he joined the navy enlisting at Sydney and receiving his basic training at Cornwallis. Ordinary Seaman Birmingham served aboard HMCS Bonaventure and HMCS Cape Scott. During this time he was also the Gun Captain of the Sunset Ceremony contingent that performed public displays throughout Canada and the US. Subsequently, Mel served as an Aircraft Technician at HMCS Shearwater. Able Seaman Birmingham left the navy in 1965.

After the navy, Mel worked briefly in the pit at Princess Colliery and as an engineer for Kodak Canada. He joined the Sydney Mines Police Department in 1973 and thereafter spent 34 years serving his community in that capacity. Officer Birmingham earned the Canadian Medal of Bravery twice for his

police work. In 2000 Mel volunteered for the newly formed United Nations Civilian Police (UNCIVPOL) contingent that was sent to Kosovo in the wake of the Yugoslav civil wars.

During this mission Mel and another officer set up a forensic unit to assist in the investigation of war crimes and ethnic cleansing. The situation was difficult with much tension and violence between ethnic groups. The UNCIVPOL forces were often attacked and on more than one occasion Mel was injured and had to retreat to the Police Office. In "lockdown" incidents they were forced to shelter in the Police Office for several days without food, water, or even heat. Mel received the UN's Kosovo Medal and the Canadian Volunteer UN Medal for his role in that mission. Today Mel and his wife live in Boularderie. They have 3 children.

### Lt Len Boudreau



#### Lt Len Boudreau Biography

Len Boudreau was born in Sydney on May 17th 1950. Before joining the army he worked with the federal department of Fisheries and Oceans. He enlisted in the army on July 1st 1976 as part of the 2nd Battalion Nova Scotia Highlanders (CB) at Victoria Park in Sydney. He completed basic officer training at CFB Aldershot and was appointed to the rank of Lieutenant. At the time of enlistment Len was married to his wife Elaine who supported his decision wholeheartedly. He says he had no hobbies per se and interest drove him to see what the military had to offer. He admits the kilt also attracted him into joining the highlanders. While training in Aldershot, Len met and worked closely with reserve officers from numerous units throughout the country.

Len had the opportunity to command a platoon during Exercise Neptune Raider in 1978-79; up until that time, this was the largest post-war military exercise. The highlanders provided an enemy force to assist the Canadian Airborne Regiment in their training. The exercise involved elements of the army, navy and air force, including destroyers, submarines, helicopters and T-33 jets. The exercise lasted two weeks and took place in many areas throughout Cape Breton Island. Len states, it was a pleasure

working alongside the pros from the Airborne Regiment, he learned so much. Len also performed in the first ever Nova Scotia Tattoo and had the honour of competing before Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, during the International Gathering of the Clans. His section competed in the Tug-a-War event.


When asked about any bad experiences, Len says that there were none. Throughout his experiences he says he has come to learn that there is no task that is insurmountable. During his time spent as Battalion Adjutant he had the opportunity to work closely with the Commanding Officer at the time, Lt. Col. Gordon Gabriel. Len lists his most memorable and proudest moment as, "When my son John enlisted with the CBH. To see him in Glengarry and kilt was a very proud moment indeed."

As for advice for those young men and women serving overseas today, they know what they are doing and are looked upon as being among the best trained soldiers within NATO. He believes people should continue to join, for the excellent training offered in leadership, decision making and teamwork. You do not realize how effective your training is until you get older and use it in life. He is very proud to have served and honored that the Cape Breton Highlanders now have their hat badge back. "We always considered ourselves to be the Cape Breton Highlanders — it is fitting to have that badge back."

## Sgt Bob Bowins



#### Sgt Bob Bowins Biography

Bob Bowins was born in July 1946 in Collingwood, Ontario. He began his military career at the age of sixteen as part of the Artillery Apprentice Plan. He enlisted in August 1962 in Toronto. Bob began his training in Shilo, Manitoba as a Gunner Apprentice. Young men who began the Apprentice Plan were known as 'Boy Soldiers'. He recalls numerous occasions when the drill Sergeant would break his drill stick during training for the Precision Drill Team. Getting ready for competition was very serious. For these competitions against Engineer Apprentices, the teams would compete in sport and drill.

Bob spent several years overseas; in 1965 he spent six months in Cyprus as a Lance Bombardier in Artillery. Here he manned an outpost on a peacekeeping mission. His next trip over was to Germany, this time he spent three years in northern Germany with NATO Forces working with the Honest John. He made his second trip to Germany in 1974 with HQ 4th Canadian Mechanized Brigade Group. In 1975 he was transferred to

Canadian Forces Europe HQ working military intelligence. In 1976, while still in Germany, Bob was promoted to Sergeant. It is here where Bob first got involved with Scouting. He made his first trip with the Beavers, to Switzerland, in 1978. He returned to camp Borden in '78 and taught at the Military Intelligence School until 1981 when he moved to Halifax with Naval HQ, where he worked for four years. He got out of the regular forces in 1986 and began work at the Canadian Forces Training Area in Meaford, Ontario where he worked as a reservist for six years. While overseas, Bob enjoyed traveling and exploring historical sites. He had the chance of visiting Bertches Gardens in Germany; this is where Hitler and his higher ranked officers had their chalet hide-aways. Bobs marks graduating from all of his courses, especially the Apprentice course and the promotion he received in Cyprus at age nineteen as his proudest moments. He has thoroughly enjoyed his time in the military and would recommend it - "Military is a good life, we had more good times than bad times - that is for certain." Bob and his wife Patricia have two children; he currently works as Commissionaire at the Point Aconi Power Plant.









## Creighton Bungay



Creighton Bungay Biography

Petty Officer Creighton Bungay was born on September 16th, 1918, in North Sydney, Nova Scotia. In September of 1941 Creighton joined the Royal Canadian Navy and served with the A5101 R.C.N.R. After completing training in Sydney, Nova Scotia, Creighton served on the Naval Destroyer the H.M.C.S. St Laurent, for three and a half years. Some of the countries that Creighton saw were Iceland, Ireland and England just to name a few. Creighton was assigned to convoy duty and took part in the D-Day invasion. The main purpose of the Naval convoys was to keep Submarines away from the Merchant Navy ships that were carrying much needed war supplies. Such honors and awards that Creighton received for his service were, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, the war 1939 -1945 Star, the North Atlantic Star, The Queen's Jubilee Medal the War Medal with Oak Leaf and the France and Germany Bar.

One of Creighton's memorable moments came when his ship went to Gibraltar to escort three aircraft carriers to Liverpool, England. When the planes took off from the carriers they flew over the escort ship and "Dipped its Wing" as a gesture of gratitude. The worst thing that Creighton encountered was the loss of fourteen ships between Boxing Day and January. While serving his country, Creighton missed the comforts of home and family and did notice a lot of young men were gone from the area due to the war. A proud moment in Creighton's life came on August 15th, 1944, when his name was published in the London Gazette by the King's Order in which, he was distinguished for "Mentioned in Dispatches for distinguished service". After being discharged in September of 1945, Creighton took up a career in fishing and later worked in the coalmines until his retirement. Creighton now resides in Alder Point and raised two children with his wife Esther

(now deceased).



Joe Burke was born on October 19th 1923 in Windsor, Ontario. He and his family moved to Cape Breton when he was just four years old. In June of 1940 at the age of 16 he enlisted into the Army at Victoria Park in Sydney. He began his career with the CBH as a Private and completed his basic training in Sydney and Glace Bay. When asked what prompted him to join the army he says with a smirk, one day he was playing hooky from school and ended up at Victoria Park with his neighbor, the next day he took in his proper paper work and began his career. Joe spent time in England, France, Holland, Belgium and Germany. When he arrived in England, he was attached to the North Shore New Brunswick Regiment headquartered out of Bathurst. He worked as a dispatch rider for their Signal Platoon. Driving through the European country he has had several accidents and spills on his motorcycle. One crash sticks out in his mind, when a car traveling towards Joe came across the center line and hit him head on, he was extremely lucky to walk away unharmed. When asked about any memorable moments with comrades, he says memorable questions come to mind. "Why would a sniper pick one person over another?" Or "Why was the shell that landed next to

us a dud, while the shell that landed over there blew a hole in the ground?" Joe says everything about war is memorable, it is something that sticks in your head – whether you like it or not. As his proudest and most memorable moment Joe recalls his visit to Windsor Castle. After a tour of the castle, he and the small group he was with were asked to sit in the back garden. The Queen Mother Mary came out to serve tea with Queen Elizabeth bringing out scones. Princess Margaret and Princess Elizabeth were also present. He had a great afternoon lunch with royalty.








#### CWO John Clarke Biography





John believes it is important to preserve the military history of Cape Breton. John continues to run the Museum in Victoria Park. He now resides in Sydney, Nova Scotia with his wife Fonnie, they have three children.





Biography

Ron Clarke was born April 3, 1940. He enlisted in the army in October 1956 at the tender age of sixteen and received his basic training at Sussex, NB. He was assigned to the Black Watch and spent the next ten years with that regiment. During this time period Ron became known as a boxer of exceptional talent. He won 30 of his 32 fights, 26 of them by knockout. In 1990 Ron was inducted into the Boxing Hall of Fame.

After his time with the Black Watch, Ron transferred to the Royal Canadian Postal Corps. For the next twenty-six years, Ron was posted to various countries including Germany, Viet Nam, Cyprus and Namibia. In addition to being part of UN Peacekeeping operations and NATO deployments, Ron's work with the Postal Corps led to him being Postmaster on various deployments. In Germany he was responsible for initiating the

overseas Santa Claus letter writing program for children of forces personnel which remains popular to this day. He was also a member of the Canadian Defense Liaison Staff.

Prior to his retirement in 1992, Sgt. Ron Clarke was the Chief Instructor at the postal school in CFB Trenton. Ron is a member of Br. 019, North Sydney, Royal Canadian Legion and also the Canadian Association of Veterans in UN Peacekeeping for whom he served as Past President of the local chapter. 



Although there were good times, Alex witnessed the causalities that come with war, noting that the Hitler Line was the most horrifying for him. During Alex's overseas service, he missed family and the comforts of civilian life. Upon arriving back in his homeland, Alex noticed that jobs were scarce but eventually he became employed as a carpenter. He later attended Vocational School: he then operated a taxi business in Sydney Mines and later worked for Sears Canada until he retired. He now resides in Sydney Mines




Staging Team in direct support of the Canadian Contingent Task Force out of Kandahar Afghanistan




## Able Seaman Eldon Critchley


ethnic cleansing that had taken place. He received the Commander In Chief Unit Citation for his efforts.

# Private Berkley Evans




## Berkley Evans Biography

With this group he travelled to Aldershot, instructors told him about the Reserves and in 1969 he enlisted with them in Glace Bay. Jim recalls beginning training and only having one uniform to worry about, the standard wool with boots, puttees and a belt. Shortly after this the Armed Forces were combined to squash any distinction between the Forces and the Reserve soldiers were issued three uniforms. Now with these uniforms, the men were not always sure which one they should be wearing, Jim joked we would dress depending on the mood of the RSM that day. Another funny mishap regarding uniforms occurred in Gagetown serving as a Sergeant, out on the machine gun range after a night out with the boys, numerous soldiers had been addressing him as Sgt. Ferguson, until finally he said, "Its Fletcher!" It turned out he and another Sergeant had their uniforms switched without

Jim's proudest moment during his service is to have the pleasure of being the Color Warrant Officer whenever the Colors were to be paraded during special events. When asked if any moments stuck out as a negative experience, only one occasion came to mind. During an exercise in Gagetown, the group was training to do a fighting patrol, marching through snow knee deep when Jim took a sharp pain in his chest. When they reached the next forming up place he gathered himself and continued the exercise. He finished the training and continued having trouble breathing until the next morning when he was taken to the hospital in Kentville. Here Jim found out he had taken a heart attack and was transported to an intensive care unit. This remained the worst experience Jim endured during his time of service.

When asked if he had any advice to offer to the young men and women currently serving our country, Jim recommends continuing your education. Tell them you want to pursue more schooling because they can and will provide it. Regarding Canada's participation in Afghanistan he believes progress has been made, but the problems they have are far from solved. "We want to show them a better way of life." Jim served thirty seven years in the military and he would not change a thing. He retired from the Armed Forces in May of 2000 with the Canadian Decoration for Service with two clasps. He says he would recommend it to all youth, the life lessons you can learn are invaluable. Jim currently resides in Dominion with his wife Ann Marie, they have two children.







Pte Don Garnier Biography


Don Garnier was born in North Sydney, Nova Scotia on November 23rd 1924. When the war began Don was just a young man, and he decided to enlist into the army, at the age of eighteen. He wanted to travel and experience the world, and more importantly, he wanted to go to battle to protect his country. So on March 14th of 1943 Don enlisted in North Sydney and began his basic training in New Glasgow. Once his training was completed, he was originally assigned to Search Lights in Vancouver, BC. Don simply stated he joined to go overseas, and if he was not sent he would go back to Cape Breton. He was part of the very next draft to go overseas.

During his time overseas, Don fought in Italy, Holland and Germany. He spent his tour of duty at the front lines as a Bren gunner. Don was in major battles in Italy and Holland, in Italy he took part in the Cassino Ridge and Coriano Ridge battles, he also spent time on what would be later known as Graveyard Hill, where Canadian soldiers received the worst shelling of the Italian campaign. Don says his worst experience in the Military happened during the Italian campaign. Don made some great


friends while enlisted, one in particular, his number two on his Bren gun would tell Don about his home and how he will forever miss the apple tree he would spend his days sitting under. Don was quick to tell him; "someday we will both sit under that tree when we return home". Don lost this dear friend on a day when the Canadian Forces were pushing the Germans back. His number two saw that Don was tiring from marching forward carrying the Bren, so he took over to let him rest. Moments later he was caught by a snipers bullet.

When asked if he missed anything about home while he was overseas, he responded, "If you did not miss twelve brothers and sisters, it would mean you have no heart." Upon returning home he missed the many new friends he had met, knowing that he would never see them again. When asked of his proudest moment during his service, he is proud he was one of many men, who stepped up to put an end to a reign of terror on earth. Upon his return to Canada, Don left the Military on March 15th 1946. He then resumed his job at the Sydney steel plant, where he stayed until he began his pension. He currently resides at Taigh Na Mara in Glace Bay, Nova Scotia. As a proud member of the Cape Breton Highlanders, he continues to write poetry and share his stories from his time in the military.













# Private Charles Gilbert




Pte Charles Wilson Gilbert Biography

Charles Wilson Gilbert was born in Sydney mines, Nova Scotia on October 12, 1921. Growing up in Sydney Mines as a teenager, Wilson worked at the local theater until he was 19 years old, when he decided to enlist into the military on September 19th, 1940 at the age of 19. He went to Sydney to sign up at Victoria Park and joined the 1st Field Company Engineers. After enlisting, he spent six months training in the Sydney area locating and extracting dud landmines in the field, honing his trade. After the six months they were put into the field with live mines, before they traveled to Halifax to get on a ship to Europe.

While overseas during the Second World War, Wilson spent time in Italy, France, Germany, Belgium and Holland. As part of the Field Engineers, he spent most of his time near the front lines, using metal detectors to find landmines in the fields. The German mines were planted all over the field of war, it was imperative to find and dispose of these before it was safe to move ahead. This was a very dangerous job to be given; Wilson assured it was most definitely not a glamorous job. When asked if there were any memorable moments, Wilson was just proud to serve his country alongside his comrades. "We

looked after each other, I met some great friends." There was great camaraderie. It was important to look after each other, as Wilson reminisced about being in the trenches they would dig out, seeing planes fly passed, hearing shells overhead and the shrapnel fly in all directions. When asked if he was ever scared doing the job he was assigned, he said there was no time to be scared. Maybe at first, but it was something you would get over quickly. When asked if he missed anything from home while he was overseas, he quickly answered, "I guess I did!" Wilson missed his family, friends and his future wife, Annie Coakley. He even missed his small town theater. Upon his arrival home he says it was an adjustment getting used to the silence in Canada. Returning back home, Wilson continued to serve for a short time before earning his honourable discharge on November 7th, 1945 and searching for a civilian job. Wilson earned several service medals during his time enlisted, he has the Italy Star, France and Germany Star, Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp and war Medal 1939-45.He began working in the Princess Colliery Mine in Sydney Mines, where he worked for 25 years until his retirement. Wilson and his wife Annie Gilbert had four children together. Wilson resides on Pond Road in Sydney Mines and to this day claims he is "shell shocked from eating too many peanuts."



His true ambition, however, was the Air Force and he quickly transferred when the opportunity presented itself. Alex received his Basic Training at Lachine, Quebec and was posted to the No. 10 Bombing and Gunnery School at Mount Pleasant, PEI.


As a Pilot Officer at Mount Pleasant he assisted with the training of Air Force personnel which included the aerial towing of targets for gunnery practice. Alex was also regularly involved in anti-submarine patrols in the Gulf of St. Lawrence and as such provided valuable air cover for convoys operating in that area.


The primary aircraft Alex operated was the Blenheim MK4 also known as the Boling-

broke bomber. Alex also piloted Fairey Battle light bombers. On one occasion, he was dispatched to an area off Cavendish where a U-boat had been sighted. After dropping depth charges and scouring the area there was no sign of the enemy vessel. He had to return to base without ever knowing if he had damaged or even struck his intended target. On another occasion Alex was forced to crash land in the ocean and was mercifully spared the fate that had befallen a comrade who had simply disappeared 20 minutes after takeoff without any trace ever being found.

After the war Alex married his wife Edith and had three daughters. He worked for the Post Office until his retirement in 1979. In his spare time he built a single-engine plane in his basement based on modified plans he had purchased. This project took four years and is noteworthy even today.










# Private Joseph A. Hawkins




Jodi Hawkins Biography

Private Joseph A. (Jodi) Hawkins was born in Bras d'Or, Nova Scotia on July 29, 1927. In January 1944, Jodi enlisted in the Royal Canadian Army. He completed his basic training in Yarmouth, as well as Aldershot, Nova Scotia and was stationed throughout Canada. While preparing to be shipped to England, word was received that the war was over: Jodi continued to serve Canada until his discharge in February of 1946, receiving the 1939-45 Canadian Voluntary Medal. On February 12th 1951, Jodi re-enlisted to serve his country once again; he served in the Korean War as a paratrooper. He completed his training in Rivers and Shylo, Manitoba, He was sent by train to Tokyo, Japan and later by boat to Korea where he served fourteen months fighting on the front lines.

Jodi did experience casualties of war such as seeing some of his fellow comrades shot and killed. One day while sitting eating his K Rations (lunch/dinner), Jodi felt something whiz past his ear, this happened a couple more times but Jodi blew it off as being flies around his head. Only, when he reached down to pick up his water canteen, and saw a bullet hole being shot straight through it, Jodi then realized that there was a sniper shooting at him. Although Jodi did enjoy serving his country, he missed his growing up years at home such as the experiences of going to teen dances and such. When he arrived home he noticed how quickly his friends had grown up. Jodi did return to the coalmines until he retired some years later. He resides in Florence where he lived with his wife Joan (now deceased), and they raised twelve

children.



# Thomas A. Howard



# Thomas A. Howard Biography

Lance Bombardier Thomas A. Howard was born on December 5th 1925, in Florence, Nova Scotia. On April 6th 1943, at the age of 17, he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Army and served with the 5th Anti-Tank Regiment. Tom completed his basic training in Yarmouth, Nova Scotia and his advanced training in Petawawa, Ontario. After serving his country, Tom was discharged in March of 1946. During his time Overseas, Tom was assigned to England, France, Belgium, Holland and Germany. Tom was involved in the Liberation of the Dutch and his tank regiment was assigned as backup for the conflict known as The Battle of the Bulge. Tom received such honours and awards as the France-Germany Star, Canadian Voluntary Service Medal and the 1939-1945 War Medal.

Some of Tom's memorable moments were with one of his comrades, George LeBlanc; Tom recalls them as having a close friendship, sharing trenches and being on leave together.

This friendship lasted well after the war ended. Tom enjoyed his comradeship with crew from all over Canada and remembers being in Quad trucks going through towns and the people being very receptive to the Canadian soldiers. At times Tom experienced hardships and recalls witnessing a comrade from Western Canada being under a truck with shrapnel wound to the back of the head. Tom felt helpless, as there was nothing he could do for his friend. While overseas, Tom desperately missed his girlfriend, Anne. Upon his return, Tom made Anne his wife. The most noticeable sight for Tom was his return from service only to discover the homestead gone and a new home erected down the road. Two weeks after Tom returned from Overseas, he resumed his work in the coalmines in which he retired after 48 years of service. Tom resides in Florence with his wife, the former Anne Bailey with whom he had seven children.





# CWO James Jackson



## CWO James Jackson Biography

James "Jim" Jackson was born in St. Peters, Nova Scotia on April 13th 1925. His family has a great military tradition, his father and older brother were in the navy, his twin brother was in the Army and his sister was in the Air Force. So naturally, when he was old enough, Jim also enlisted. He joined the army in 1943 in Halifax as a Private. His basic training was completed in Yarmouth, NS. He says the training was tough; they did not have much of the amenities those would have today.

Jim spent much of his early career overseas, he has seen action in the UK, Korea, Vietnam, Cyprus, Egypt, Golan, Gaza Strip and Japan. Jim's travels had their memorable experiences, both good and bad. In Syria the men would go on hikes, on one particular hike the men found a donkey and took him back to base with them. The donkey jumped in the jeep with the soldiers and immediately became their mascot. Time spent overseas were not all laughs, in Korea, where Jim was the Warrant Officer, there was a constant danger. In Vietnam the bombers were always overhead, dropping on villages and schools. Korea was particularly dangerous, because of the numerous hills and valleys it was very easy to be ambushed. One of his worst experiences in the military happened in

Vietnam, Jim recalls being in choppers during fighting, when a chopper left the designated route for a short-cut, Jim says he watched the lead chopper get shot down by a group of teenage girls from the North Vietnam Army.

While he was away Jim missed family and friends. After his retirement from the military Jim became a hunting safety instructor with the Department of Lands and Forests and later became the commissionaire at the Canso Causeway. He also went to schools to talk about and make children aware of the problems caused by bullying. By the time he had retired, Jim collected many medals. He has the Order of Military Merit, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, War Medal 1939-45, Korea Medal, UN Service Medal, Un Medal (Cyprus), International Commission of Control and Supervision Medal (Vietnam) and the Canadian Forces Decoration with clasp. His proudest moment was in 1976, when he took his mother to Ottawa to receive a Medal of Military Merit from the Governor General.

When asked if he had any advice for the young men and women currently serving this country, Jim says to join the forces with a cause – listen and obey- obedience is important. "Get along with your fellow men and women, regardless of credence or color". Jim currently resides in the Veterans Wing in Harbourview Hospital in Sydney Mines. "Everyone here is so nice, all the nurses and staff here are the kindest you could ever, meet."



## Mike Laffin Biography


Dr. Mike Laffin was born January 12, 1918 in New Waterford. He enlisted in the Air Force in 1941 and received his "Wings" as a flying officer in May 1942. Mike was assigned a Halifax bomber designated as LK-801 of the Bluenose Squadron. As the Allied bombing of German targets increased in the latter part of the war, Mike flew some 24 sorties over France, Belgium, Holland and Germany.

On June 16, 1944 Mike's bomber was shot down near the border of Germany and Holland. Mike was injured but survived along with most of his crew. Fellow crewmember, Clarence Soderstrom from Edmonton was not so fortunate. Mike evaded capture for several days before being turned in by Nazi

sympathizers. Mike spent the remainder of the war in a German POW camp where he was appointed camp leader. When Germany surrendered in May of 1945, Mike volunteered for service in the Pacific but the surrender of the Japanese in August relieved him of service in that theatre.

After the war, Mike completed his pre-med at St. FX and then received his degree in Dentistry from McGill University. He operated a dental practice in New Waterford for many years. He was elected to represent Cape Breton Centre the Nova Scotia Legislature from 1963-1974 and again from 1981-1988. Today Mike lives in New Waterford with his wife Doris. He is a lifetime member of Br. 015, New Waterford, Royal Canadian Legion.





## Nick Laffin



Nick Laffin was born April 3, 1924. He enlisted in the army in 1943 at Halifax and received his basic training at Yarmouth. Assigned to the 8th Reconnaissance Regiment of the 2nd Canadian Infantry Division, he trained as wireless operator, gunner and driver of light armoured vehicle. The 8th Recce also known as the 14th Canadian Hussars was sent overseas and saw action in Normandy, Belgium, Holland and Germany.

Nick was wounded on two occasions. In Belgium he suffered damaged eardrums and a broken hand after being hit by an artillery round. Later, in Germany, he was shot in the back by a wounded German soldier after the town had surrendered. On another occasion he was stunned by an artillery burst and collapsed among dead comrades. 

### Clarence B. Landry Biography

Able Seaman Clarence Landry was born on September 30, 1924, Sydney, NS. On September 30, 1943, Clarence enlisted in the Royal Canadian Navy to do his part for the war effort and was discharged on December 7, 1945. He was sent to Quebec City, Quebec, and then to Cornwallis, Nova Scotia, for basic training. Clarence departed Canada for convoy duty in the Atlantic Ocean on the H.M.C.S. Levis. While on tour duty, Clarence saw many ports including: Nassau, Bermuda, Miami, the American Eastern Seaboard and Newfoundland. During the down time, he enjoyed spending time with his comrades seeing the local sights, playing crib and sometimes singing war songs. The little things made time long, and Clarence missed his family, girlfriend, and good home cooking. What stands out in Clarence's mind as a horror of war would be fighting alongside a ship only to watch be torpedoed.

However, after the war ended, the best thing Clarence ever saw were the lights being turned on board the merchant ships and of course the Gulf Coast. When Clarence arrived home, he had already enlisted for another tour of duty in the Pacific. However, the war with Japan had ended while Clarence was on leave. Things had changed when Clarence was away fighting for his country, but it was noticeable to Clarence when looking at the neighborhood children who were now young men and women. For his dedication to his country, Clarence received the Atlantic Star 1939-1945 and his Volunteer medal 1939-1945. After the war ended Clarence was slowly becoming used to his civilian life again and it took about a month before he took up the trade as a meat cutter. Clarence now resides in

## Trooper Donald LeDrew



Donald LeDrew Biography

Trooper Donald LeDrew was born September 18, 1925. He enlisted in 1942 at Halifax and received his basic training at Brampton. Donald was assigned to the Sherbrooke Fusiliers. He was deployed overseas and served in England, Belgium, Holland, and Germany. The Sherbrooke Fusiliers were an armoured regiment equipped with Sherman tanks. They were engaged almost constantly from D-Day onward and, although Donald was fortunate to be in a reserve company, he saw firsthand the effects of war. As an example, he was in the vicinity of Arnhem after the fateful Operation Market Garden which was the subject of the movie "A Bridge Too Far". He

described a scene of devastation with crashed gliders, demolished buildings, and the charred corpses of men and animals.

On VE day, Donald was in Zutphen, Holland where he and his comrades celebrated alongside the grateful Dutch citizens. For his wartime service Donald received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, The France and Germany Star, and the Dutch Medal of Remembrance. After the war, Donald worked at the Sydney Steel Plant until his retirement in 1987. Donald and his wife, Evelyn, live in Sydney Mines. They have two children.







Maj Bill Lloy Biography

Major Bill Lloy was born on February 23rd 1958 in Halifax, Nova Scotia. He grew up in Dartmouth and enlisted in Halifax into the 1st Field Regiment of Royal Canadian Artillery in 1975. Bill decided to join the military for the opportunity of gainful employment and the prospect of travel. As he trained with the Regiment he continued his schooling. Bill won the shooting competition with the last bullet and chose the 45 Field Engineering Squadron. Bill completed a short stint in Munich, Germany as a senior Canadian Officer during NATO Engineering training. Bill lists Swiss Air as his only unpleasant experience, Bill and many others were asked to mobilize in a time of disaster, the incredible jobs and depth of character of those involved will be something that sticks with Bill

He will never forget the times he has spent training with soldiers. It is a special relationship, building camaraderie with others who put out their greatest efforts together. Being accepted as a Cape Breton Highlander means a lot to him. "When you sink your heart and soul into a unit, being acknowledged and accepted is a really good feeling."

Bill currently lives in Sydney, Nova Scotia with his wife Deana and children, Samantha and Michael. He works as a Denturist at his business, Lloy's Denture Clinic, Glace Bay.










### MWO Bob Luker






Bill MacArthur Biography



He enlisted in North Sydney as a gunner and completed his basic training in Picton, Ontario at the School of Artillery and Officer Training. Over the years within the military he says he has met with so many fantastic people, and has collected many great memories with his comrades. Some of his favorite times were just standing around with the men and exchanging stories. The annual camps were always a memorable experience, especially once Douglas was promoted to Major and appointed Commanding Officer of A Company 2nd Battalion Nova Scotia Highlanders situated in North Sydney. Doug remembers commanding the last Militia exercise at Aldershot.

He became a head instructor at the AVTC Marconi Campus in Sydney. Doug continued to teach until his retirement in 1986. ## Private Jim MacDonald




Pte Jim MacDonald Biography

Jim Macdonald was born on September 15, 1925 in Sydney Mines, Nova Scotia. He enlisted into the army as a Pte on May 18th 1944 in Halifax, Nova Scotia at the age of 18. He joined with the North Nova Scotia Highlanders and completed his training in Yarmouth and Aldershot, Nova Scotia. Jim says he made the decision to join because during the Second World War there was not much work. Upon the completion of basic training Jim was shipped out to Aldershot, England. On Christmas Eve 1944, the SS Pasteur left Halifax and travelled down the coast to the south to duck around the submarines in the Atlantic. Jim recalls leaving in a snowstorm and just hours later sitting on the deck with no shirt on catching some sun. The Pasteur landed in England on New Year's Eve. He spent January training in England, before mobilizing and moving out to Belgium for a month. After Belgium, Jim was sent to the front lines in

Jim spent three weeks on the front lines in Holland, living in the trenches. He was part of the 3rd Platoon of the North Novies. This is where he spent the remainder of the war. He recalls hearing

the news that the war had ended, while he and his comrades were at a farm house in the afternoon. He recalls thinking, it doesn't feel like it is over, because the there were still German guns ringing in the sky. Following the end of the war, Jim joined the Occupation Force that was put into place in Germany; he spent the next year training and sharing guard duties with members of this force, until he boarded the ship RMS Aquitania in July of 1946 to take him home. Jim got his discharge from the military one month after returning from Germany.

When asked if he missed anything while he was overseas or upon his return home, Jim missed everything from home, all the small things and upon his return he asserts there was nothing to miss about being a foot soldier, except the pay. Jim was making a dollar a day, at the end of the month he could send twenty dollars home and keep ten for himself. This was a big deal at the time because once he returned home Jim recalls jobs being scarce. He eventually started a job with Marine Atlantic where he worked up until his retirement in March of 1989. Jim now resides in Sydney Mines, Nova Scotia with his wife Frances, they have five children.

## Colonel Ian MacIntyre



### Col Ian MacIntyre Biography

Colonel Ian Macintyre was born on February 4th 1941 in Yarmouth, Nova Scotia. He joined the Royal Canadian Army Cadets, in 1954. Two years later he joined 2nd Battalion, The Nova Scotia Highlanders (CB) in Sydney, Nova Scotia as a Private. He completed his basic training between Sydney and Camp Aldershot. Colonel Macintyre's career with the military has been one of great joy. "It was all memorable and fun, an overall great experience." One of his most memorable experiences was assisting in the restoration of the Cape Breton Highlanders name. There was a great deal of community assistance, throughout the endeavor, and he appreciated being a part of it. The announcement was made by Minister of National Defense, Peter MacKay on January 16th

2011 at the Gaelic College in St. Anne's, Nova Scotia. It was special to have the announcement so close to the roots of the Regiment, which was raised in Baddeck. His five years serving as President of the Cape Breton Highlanders Association remains one of his proudest military connections. Ian appreciates the Canadian Forces' great sense of humor and can-do attitude, plenty of laughs and good times always helped you forget about the tough times. Ian says this stems all the way back to the reputation of our veterans, a WW II running joke from their time was, "How do you get to Berlin? Make it out of bounds to the Highlanders!" It is nice to be known to have a 'cool' attitude in a 'hot' area, and Canada's Forces have that reputation internationally.

When asked about Canada's current participation on the world stage, he says that Canada has a responsibility in the global village to assist oppressed populations and repair dysfunctional regimes. As we do this, trust your comrades and look after them. Love Canada.

Ian now resides in Sydney River, Nova Scotia with his wife Mia LeGresley Macintyre. He was appointed Honorary Colonel of the Nova Scotia Highlanders on May 15th 2010 and with the renaming of the Cape Breton Highlanders in January 2011, he became its Honorary Colonel as well.

Duncan MacKeigan

Biography

Private John Duncan MacKeigan was born on March 20, 1924 in North Sydney, NS. On August 25, 1942 at the age of eighteen vears, Duncan enlisted in the Royal Canadian Army and served in the 1st Canadian Parachute Battalion and later the North Shore Regiment. He was sent to Yarmouth, Nova Scotia for basic training. Duncan was assigned to numerous countries such as: England, France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany. While on tour duty, Duncan was involved in action such as "Crossing of the Oran River", "Battle of the Bulge", Liberation of Devenger, Holland", "Niamegan", "Grous Beach" and "Cleve, Germany". While on leave, Duncan and his comrades would tour a lot of the cities and towns that they were in but Duncan missed his family and good home cooked meals.

Although Duncan was shot three times himself, between1944 and 1945, what stands out in Duncan's mind as a horror of war was when one of his comrades was shot in the head but was still alive. Duncan and one of his other comrades were chosen to go out and retrieve the wounded soldier and bring him back to the medics. When they ran across to where the soldier laid, one of the other soldiers asked them, how did you get there so fast? They replied that they ran across the field, he then told them that you better find another route back as that field was a land mine. When Duncan and his comrade brought the wounded soldier back to the medics, Duncan had to hold the wounded soldiers tongue so it wouldn't fall back into his windpipe and choke him. Duncan brought back some good memories with him and his fellow comrade Private Paddy Brogan. They had lots of laughs through all of the battles that they went through. In every village they went through, Paddy would make it a mission to get a chicken and he would only let the boys from Sydney Mines eat the chicken. After being home for a month, Duncan went to work for CN, now known as Marine Atlantic until his retirement. Duncan resides in Sydney Mines with his wife Freda.






















### Martin MacKinnon




Martin MacKinnon Biography

Martin MacKinnon was born May 23, 1926. With a youthful yearning to "go to sea" he enlisted in the Merchant Marine in 1944 after a medical condition dashed his hopes of joining the navy. Martin was subsequently assigned to a series of merchant vessels including Park Ships, which were the Canadian equivalent of the American "Liberty" merchant vessels. Starting out as an Engineer's Messman he served aboard the Kerma, Philip P. Dodge, Mayfair Park, and Stanley Park. These vessels operated between Sydney and Newfoundland and down into the Caribbean/West Indies.

Martin enjoyed life at sea and as the war wound down he was spared the fate of many sailors such as those who perished aboard the SS Livingstone. Martin's ship came across an empty lifeboat from that tanker after she had been sunk by U-541 sixty miles

east of Scatarie. At war's end Martin was, by chance, in Halifax and witnessed the VE Day riots firsthand. After the war he sailed aboard lake boats and served in the Canadian Coast Guard aboard the CCGS Nanook and CCGS John A. MacDonald as an engineer. He finished his career with Marine Atlantic as a Senior Engineer after sailing aboard numerous vessels in that fleet.

Martin is a member of Br. 128, Whitney Pier, Royal Canadian Legion where he has served as Past President and currently serves as 1st Vice President. He is also President of the Cape Breton Naval Veterans Association and 1st Vice President of the League of Merchant Mariners local chapter. He resides in South Bar with his wife, Gloria. They have six children.

### Eric MacLean Biography

Eric MacLean was born July 23, 1936. He enlisted in the army on January 20, 1954 at Sydney and received his basic training at Fort Osborne in Winnipeg. Eric was in good company as 11 other soldiers from North Sydney signed up at about the same time. As a member of the 1st Royal Canadian Horse Artillery he trained as a gunner and a driver but his proudest moment was when he received his paratrooper "wings". He recalls an incident when after jumping from the aerial transport fondly referred to as a "flying boxcar", the chute of one of his comrades didn't open. The seemingly doomed man grabbed onto the man alongside of Eric. Despite the danger, both men

### landed safely.

After leaving the service in 1957, Eric worked in the "pit" for several years before settling in as long haul truck driver for Canada Liquid Air. He spent 30 plus years in that profession before his retirement. Eric is a lifetime member of Br. 019, North Sydney, Royal Canadian Legion. He has diligently served in most of the offices of that branch and is currently a member of the executive. Eric and his wife Jacqueline currently live in Sydney Mines and they have one daughter.

## Private Harold MacNeil



Pte Harold MacNeil Biography

Harold 'Butch' Macneil was born on August 6th 1947 in Sydney Mines, Nova Scotia. When Butch turned eighteen, a friend of his was a part of the Black Watch and had told him all about it. Butch was single at the time and decided he wanted to join as well so he enlisted for the Army in Sydney at Victoria Park on November 4th 1965. Butch completed his basic training in Gagetown, New Brunswick. Before joining the Black Watch in Gagetown, Butch spent one year training with the 2nd Battalion Nova Scotia Highlanders.

During his time enlisted Butch spent six months in Cyprus between 1967 and 1968 working as a radio operator out of a Command Post. During his time in Cyprus there was a threat of Turkey attacking, during this everyone on duty was on high alert and issued live ammunition. Butch says he was by himself through the night on his post in a tin hut. A buddy of his, who had a few drinks decided to go visiting. When he arrived at Butch's hut he began banging on the walls, being on high alert Butch did not take this lightly and readied his gun only to find out there was no threat behind the door. Another funny story Butch recalled from his time in Cyprus occurred during a week leave from duties. The men

had hired a cab driver to tour them around Famagusta. On their travels they came across a Turkish checkpoint. Everyone was asked to exit the vehicle and follow the guards, who were all equipped with guns yelling "move!" The Canadian soldiers did not know what was going on, they were forced to wait for an interpreter to help figure out the situation. The men felt uneasy, but it turned out the guards at the checkpoint were not concerned with the Canadian soldiers, their interest was in the Cyprus cab driver.

Butch's most memorable experience during his time of duty is meeting with the Queen Mother in 1967 as part of the Centennial Review in Gagetown. She was in town as the Colonel in Chief of the regiment. Graduating from the Depot will always remain as a proud moment for Butch.

Regarding the Afghan conflict, Butch says that they are doing a great job but it is always tough to lose soldiers over there. For the young men and women currently serving, Butch says, "Keep your spirits up and be careful."

Butch received his discharge on November 4th 1968 when he met his future wife, Geraldine. The two wed in 1969, after which, they moved to Oshawa, Ontario. Butch returned to Nova Scotia in 1976, he worked repairing and building electronics and Arcade games. He and his wife currently reside in North Sydney, Nova Scotia.





Tony's Story

My name is Tony Lipton. I was born on 24 August 1916 in Glace Bay and I am the oldest of 14 children, seven boys and seven girls. Two of my brothers are deceased now. If all my siblings had lived there would have been 21 of us. My mother just had her 105<sup>th</sup> birthday and she resides at The MIRA Nursing Home.

When I was around two years, old my family moved to Stellarton. I went to school completing grade seven and I liked my seventh

grade teacher so much I stayed there for two years. Sisters of Charity taught me. Anyway, after grade seven I just quit. I went to work because as the oldest I had to help my parents. My Dad worked in the mines, so I went to work in the mines too plus I did any odd jobs that I could find. When I would get my pay from the mines I would go home and give it to my Mother and she in turn would give me \$2.00 back. In 1939, I went to work in a box factory at Grand Lake around Enfield area. I stayed there for eight to 10 months.

In June 1940, my friend Joe Wilsack convinced me to go to New Glasgow to join the Army. There was a long line waiting to get into the Pictou Highlanders; another long line to get into the North Nova Scotia Regiment; and another outfit with a long line of guys waiting. Joe said he had a friend Jim White who was a dragger man at the mines. So we went to see him and told him we had our First Aid Certificates and it just happened that was exactly what  $22^{nd}$  Field Ambulance was looking for. He gave them our names and that's how we got in. I got in with a bad knee but Joe didn't get in because they couldn't see his chest in an x-ray. He did get in later though. You see we had to have drag to get into the Army!

I met a young woman in 1936 and by now we had been together four years but we had no money to get married. The Army informed us that we would be sent overseas in six weeks. My girlfriend worked as a head pastry girl at the Green Lantern Restaurant in Halifax so I called her and asked her to marry me. She wanted me to give her two months but I told her I was leaving in six weeks. She said, "What about my Mom and Dad?" to which I responded, "I'm not interested in your Mom and Dad, I'm interested in you." I told her I'd call her the next night at 6:00 p.m. The next night I called her, there were one or two rings. I asked her again and she responded, "well yes". I told her that was good because I had all the arrangements made. You see I didn't want to go overseas without marrying her. I thought if I didn't come back, she'd at least have a little money coming to her. We married on 3 August 1940 at Saint Mary's Basilica in Halifax. Her name was Catherine Henman. Those six weeks turned out to be 12 months later because I didn't go overseas until July 21, 1941. In the meantime, Catherine became pregnant. We rented an upstairs house on









Wood Street in Truro for \$5.00 a month, no lights and no water. A lorry, which is a big truck, would make daily rounds from Debert to Truro and return daily. That's how I got back and forth to work.

Now Catherine was about eight months pregnant when we got word of leaving for overseas. But we didn't know exactly when we were going and when I found out I couldn't get word to my wife. When we were loaded on the train I was given a great big chocolate bar. There was a guard outside and there was no way I could get past him to let my wife know I was leaving. I happened to see a MacKay girl we knew and she went by the car train I was on. I managed to get the car window open and got her attention. I asked her to give the chocolate bar to Catherine and to tell her this was it. It was like a ton of bricks off my back knowing that I got word to her. I was overseas just two weeks when I received word that we had a baby girl.


We arrived at Pier 21 and boarded an oriental boat ORION. We landed at Cardiff Wales and from there boarded a train to Aldershot. I was never in action. We route marched an awful lot. We move around Southern England in Kent County. This was probably mostly 3rd Division to my knowledge. By now after 2-1/2 years in the Army on cross country route marches with full packs of 47 pounds and going about 15 miles. Anyway I dropped back about 1 mile from camp and met another man who dropped back also. He had flat feet. At camp supper that night I couldn't get up and I couldn't straighten my knee up. I had dry knee that turned out to be arthritis at the seat of the injury. I said to some man from Stewiacke, "don't leave, I can't get up". I lay awake thru the night and decided to go to sick parade the next morning. There were 15 men ahead of me with blisters. When the Doctor got to me he told me to take my shoes off, as he thought I had blisters too. Instead I pulled up my pant leg and as he looked at it he asked me "who let you in the Army?" to which I responded, "you did".

I was put in a general hospital outside London. It was a kind of cute operating hospital. There were about 10 patients there and the nurses couldn't wait to get you. They would heat "pigs" or hot water bottles to warm our feet at night. I was there about a month.

As time went on, I was put on a category for my knee. I ended up in Basing stoke, outside London where I was a training orderly sent there to work on the boat coming home. I was there approximately 1-1/2 years. I kind of liked that kind of work and thought I would like to continue doing it in life because I was helping people. I next remember boarding the Isle de France to return back home.

February 14, 1944 probably around 8:00 p.m. the train landed in Truro. It was cold when I landed home and rapped at the door. As soon as my wife saw me she ran upstairs to get the baby to show her to me. I've got to tell you my wife caused more trouble within my unit. Every month she got \$76.00 and her pattern upon receiving her cheque was to look after me first. Every month she would send me 1,000 cigarettes and a parcel. In the parcel would be a mouth organ, toothpaste, cookies, date squares, you name it. Guys used to joke and say what's the second thing you're going to do when you get home to which the response was - take the backpack off!

And so I got to meet this beautiful plump little girl named Sally. But you see Sally's father was a picture on the mantle. So after about 25 days of trying to warm up to this little girl, I went out and bought her a red rocking horse for \$2.00. That was the turning point. And to this day, Sally still has that red rocking horse!








After my 28 days leave was up, I went back to No. 11 Depot in Halifax to work and come home every weekend. We weren't doing too badly until one weekend I was put on fire duty and had to stay in Halifax. I told my Sergeant I wanted to see the Officer in Charge. He paraded me in and I proceeded to tell him that I was in the Army for 4 years and was never in trouble. I went on to explain to him that I had a little girl born while I was overseas and that it took me a long time to win her over, and if I didn't go home for two weeks, I would lose all I had gained with her. The OC told the Sergeant to take me off fire duty.

Two months later the Doctor that signed me in the Army, signed me out of the Army. Every two years over approximately six years I had to go to Camp Hill where the same Doctor always saw me.

I saw a lot of death. At the Plastic Surgery Neurological Hospital there were nine buildings and 18 wards. Each ward had 15 beds on the left side, then a horseshoe, and then another 15 beds on the right side. We only had a little night-light to work with. One night in particular that I remember it was around one or two in the morning. Everyone was awake and I was going around taking their orders for juice or whatever. As I was making my rounds I heard a man behind me and when I looked he was huge, looked like Lil Abner. He was following me and making strange noises. I began to sweat and everyone kept asking, "What are you going to do Orderly?" That strange man followed me until about the second last bed. I realized there wasn't one man in the ward that could help me. Then it came to me that I was the boss there! I turned to that man and in a loud voice I said, "What are you doing out of bed?" I ordered him in bed and I made darn sure he was well tucked in. It was kind of sad you know.

Then there was another time when I asked one of the patients to do me a favor and help clean the ashtrays. The ashtrays were always full. He wouldn't help me. Then the day came when he needed an enema so I asked the nurse if carbolic soap would cause any damage. She told me she thought it would sting a little but that it was not damaging. Well I mixed some of the soap in the enema and administered it. Well let me tell you he had fire in his eyes when he came out of the washroom and I never had trouble getting his help after that!

I remember when I was on the boat that left Greenock, Scotland; the Friday night "law of the sea" was that you didn't leave before midnight. Word got to us to get the sick bay ready because a Ship's Company man needed his appendix out. We had an officer specialist going back to Toronto with us. Our Major got the specialist to operate. He told us that the operation on Civilian Street would cost \$500.00. On that trip we started out with a man on the ward covered with eczema from head to toe. Another man had both his eyes out. It was either the first or second night out that a rap came on the ward door. There was a little blond woman and she told me her husband was in the ward - he was the man with no eyes. I took her in and she stayed all night with him but I made sure she was out by six a.m. It turned out she slept with him every night. Two or three nights after we left we were once again told to get the Sick Bay ready. This time there was a POW u-boat sailor who needed to have his appendix out. He was a little blond about nineteen years old. There were two guards on him and we named him Willie.

As time went on we'd get some guys in who had CLAP. At one point there were eleven of them. We had to give them two big tablets, sulfarthyson, every four hours. They looked like peppermints and we had to make sure they took them. Halfway through an officer came in. He was a ferry pilot who looked just like Gregory Peck. He had the CLAP. I asked him where in hell he got it. He said that two weeks back he was with his wife. She didn't know he was coming home and he didn't know what to do. I suggested that he

go home, pick up his wife and take her to the doctor. That was the end of the story. He just wanted someone to give him some advice.

Among the POWs there was a man who was the Captain of the pocket battleship Sharnhorse. Our officer, a Major, told us this POW was coming up to the Sick Bay to visit Willie and it would be nice if we came to attention when he arrived, out of respect. Up come this little man with a nice suit, little black beard, but no hat. Everyone came to attention and he looked us up and down. As he passed the man with no eyes and the man with the bad eczema, he patted them on their heads. After that he saw a man in the Galley doing pots and pans and he said, "same as in Germany". He spoke good English.

While in International waters the loudspeaker announced that we had two hours to buy things at the canteen. Willie was going to Cogswell Street Hospital and I decided to take up a collection to buy him some goodies, hoping to leave a good taste in his mouth. Everybody agreed. While collecting I tried to stay clear of the man with no eyes. He said, "Orderly, something is going on". I said, "Oh, it's nothing" but he insisted he wanted to know what was going on. So I told him I was taking up a collection for Willie and the man with

no eyes gave me 54 crown. Even the guards gave me money. I went to the canteen and bought chocolate bars, toothpaste, etc. whatever. Upon presenting Willie with a bag of goodies, he cried.

In my civilian life, I was an Engine man on the railroad for 33 years. On August 3, 2000, Catherine and I were married 60 years. We had nine children, six girls and three boys. We lost a son in 1960 in an accident. We have 22 grandchildren and 21 great grandchildren. My wife passed away on August 30, 2000 of a massive brain hemorrhage.

I am a Legion member. I live in Parkland Estates. It's an assistant living residence. My hobby is making Jacob's ladder in bottles. I've been doing this since 1962 and have made approximately 1,500. I believe in keeping things simple and I always look for the good in people. You see, everyone has some good in them; and there are two sides to every story.



#### Lloyd's Story

My name is Lloyd MacDonald. I was born on 13 June 1919 in Gabrus,
Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia. I was the oldest of two boys and three
girls. At the age of 14, I quit school after completing grade eight. I went to work for my Dad who was a self-

girls. At the age of 14, I quit school after completing grade eight. I went to work for my Dad who was a selfemployed fisherman. In 1941, I went to Sydney and joined the Army as a Radar Operator.

I took my Basic Training in Yarmouth and was sent to Petawawa for my Advanced Training. My unit was being sent overseas but I got sick on the train and ended up in Debert with the mumps, and in quarantine. By the time I got out my unit was gone overseas to form up a radar unit. I was given papers to go overseas on my own, and they didn't even give me embarkation leave. I was put onboard the SS ANDES out of Halifax and landed at Mercy Docks in Liverpool. Across the harbour the docks were all aflame and being night time we couldn't see too much. The Germans were bombing the hell out of Liverpool, England. I was shipped by rail to some camp in England that I can't remember the name of. I went by rail in Yovall in South England and met up with my unit. Canada had no radar unit so I spent a year in the British Army getting acquainted with radar. This was around April 1942 at the entrance to Portsmouth, England. Then I got sick again and spent 3-4 months in the hospital. When I got out I gladly went back to the Canadian Army. Grub and pay was bad, but it was worse in the British Army.

Now we were in a mixed Battery with approximately 200 female ATS. We worked together at a rocket site in Portsmouth. Sometimes the German planes would be over us before we heard them. We were the 2<sup>nd</sup> Heavy Anti-Aircraft with 1,600 members. There were three Batteries and each Battery had two troops with four guns. There was one radar site to each four guns. We sent out the bearings, angles and range. It was pretty much the same principle as used today. Information is from the radar to the guns.

We were in action pretty much all the time. There were German planes over us almost every night and sometimes throughout the day. I was scared. Then we went to France where I lost a lot of my buddies. Three in my outfit were killed outright. My unit used to send balloons with radar reflectors up in the air to follow the weather. Information was passed on to the Air Force. Some of the balloons went up as high as 60,000 feet and when they were that high, they enlarged as big as a five-story building.

Once we took up position 1-1/2 miles from Cap Gris Nez, near Calais. By noon we were dug in an open field and the Sergeant and I thought we would walk to lunch. We were halfway across the field when the Germans

fired on us. I tell you when a 2,000-pound shell lands 50 feet in front of you, you just lay and pray. In that battle the Germans destroyed four of our guns, killed four and injured many. We were shelled for 1-1/2 hours. Our cook was shaving against a tree and the top of his head was cut off. Our Commander ordered us to leave the guns and get into nearby caves until dark. That's how we got out.

After that, my unit sent me to Belgium where I guided planes and did weather reports for about 1-1/2 months. Then we were set up in Dunkirk part of the winter building a border. There were Germans there and at meal time the gunner would shoot a few rounds to keep them active. I met a guy from Saint John, NB. 44-46 years later that had been taken prisoner of war at Dunkirk. He recalled to me how the Canadians would send in airbursts when they were being marched for their meals.

I was then sent to Holland and up to Germany doing the same job. That year on the 1<sup>st</sup> of April they were going to let one man go on leave to England. Out of 1,600 men, my name got picked. I spent two weeks on leave in England. It took me almost a week to get there. I went to see the girlfriends. I still hear from one yet. I stood with her and her husband when they got married.

On the 5<sup>th</sup> of May we overran a civilian camp where the SS were trying to burn down the barracks. There were lots of kids with swollen bellies. We were left guarding 15-20,000 German prisoners who lived in tents with wired fences around them. These were mostly young men officers. One night they even hung their own commander. We never abused any of them. There were about 200 horses. I remember we marched the prisoners to Holland to return the stolen horses to the farmers. There were trucks ahead, on the sides and in back of the prisoners. But coming back we put the prisoners in trucks. You couldn't trust the young guys; some as young as 14.

I left Scotland on the 8<sup>th</sup> of July and landed in Halifax on the 13<sup>th</sup> of July. I took the first train out to Sydney arriving that night. There were two girls who met me first and my father and a sister. I didn't even know my own sister. I was on leave for 30 days and went fishing with my Dad every day and chased girls all night. I was discharged on 10 October end of demobilization. For two years I fished with my father and then I got a job with the Department of Fisheries. I worked for them for 30 years.

I married Daisy Latham on 20 July 1948 and we had two children, a boy and a girl. That union lasted 11 years. On 25 November 1960, I married Bethena Stubbert. She passed away on 18 January 2002. I have three grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

I've been a member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch No. 12 in Sydney for 41 years. I'm also a member of Normandy Veterans Association No. 58 N.S. Branch No. 1. I reside at Parkland Estates and for hobbies I

play darts and bowl.

My name is Ryland Leroy Marshall. I was born 24 December 1921 in

Truro, NS and I'm the second oldest of five children. What a bad time to be born. I always got gypped out of birthday presents and rarely had a birthday party. The house I was born in is still standing at 27 Exhibition Street, straight across from the main door of the Legion. The man who built the house was a counterfeiter who got caught and was sent to jail; so my father got a real good deal out of it. We were a close family. My Dad worked at Stanfield's and I had two younger brothers who were in the Army and both were in Normandy. Thank God all three of us returned home from the war.

After I graduated from High School, I completed one year of studies in Sciences at the Nova Scotia Agriculture College. In 1941, I went down to Halifax to join the Air Force but when they gave me the medical I failed the eye sight portion. I told the guy doing the testing that I really wanted to get into the military so he advised me to go try the Navy. He said the Navy didn't have the equipment to do eye tests that the Air Force had and he told me what to do when it came time for my eye test. His words of wisdom were "doing both hands over the same eye". So I went to the Navy recruiters, did what I was told, and passed. I went back home to Truro waiting for my call. In the meantime I had an appendix attack and had surgery. Well I recovered and by Spring of 1942 I was enlisted in the Navy.

I took communication training in Saint-Hyacinthe, Quebec and by summer I was sent back to Halifax onboard the corvette HMCS *Battleford*. I served there for three years. The HMCS *Battleford* did convoy duty between St. John's, Newfoundland and Ireland and the Mediterranean. We escorted all transportation ships, freighters, tankers, whatever went overseas. I made approximately 58 trips

over and back! My job as a Coder was to decode all secret messages that came in.

The first six months I was onboard, I was seasick all the time. I couldn't eat and let me tell you it wasn't much of a life. I slept in a hammock and wore the same clothes 12 days at a time with no showers. I drank a lot of tomato juice. The food on ship was pretty good once I was able to keep it down. Those corvettes were so rough that when food was placed on the tables it very quickly ended up on the floor. I remember one young man who was seasick as well. He was fairly new on the ship and one-day he just disappeared. He apparently jumped overboard and committed suicide.

In those days we only made about \$1.25 a day. Whenever we were in St. John's, Newfoundland over a 3 to 4-day stint, I would get a bed at the Salvation Army for \$1.00 per night. It was like being in a hotel and a bit like heaven after sleeping in those hammocks and it was the best \$1.00 I ever spent.

On the way to the Mediterranean, the convoys were attacked by u-boats at night and aircrafts by day. Many of the freight transportation ships were torpedoed but we weren't allowed to stop. We would just scoop men out of the water, one at a time

and many men were left behind in the water. One incidence I particularly remember was when we picked up a US Merchant Marine who was badly burnt. I gave up my hammock for him to sleep in and for the next 10-12 nights I slept on the deck. And I don't think that deck stopped rolling the entire time I slept on it!

I recall once we made a half trip to Murmansk, Russia. The reason it was a half trip was because the ship would ice up on one side causing it to tip so we had to go back to Ireland.

My superiors recommended me for Commissioning from the Ranks, and if selected I would have been sent to King's College in Halifax to study. But, they caught up with my eye problem and offered me a discharge. I refused and lied, and told them my records indicated good eye sight when I joined so it had to have happen while I was in the service.


I volunteered for Japan but they surrendered before I was sent over. I was released from the military in September 1945 end of demobilization. After the war I went to Nova Scotia Technical College in Halifax and studied Electrical Engineering for three years. It was a special course offered after the war. Upon completion I stayed and taught for five years and then I went to work at Stanfield's where I worked for 33 years and retired as Vice President.

I joined the Royal Canadian Legion Colchester N.S. Branch No. 26 on January 4, 1947. This is my 59<sup>th</sup> year. I was President when the present building was being built. In 1985 I received the Diamond Jubilee Medal and received Life Membership in 1999. I was also President at the Truro Golf Club, Rotary Club, Chamber of Commerce and Vice President of the Curling Club.

I met Doris Hunt in Truro and in 1950 we got married in Halifax. We have two children, a son and a daughter, who both reside in Truro and two granddaughters. We lost Doris on 29 February 2004 and I miss her very much.

If war was on and everyone was joining I'd do it all again! I sure wouldn't look forward to the seasickness again though!



John Joseph McCabe was born on 18 December 1926 in Truro, Nova Scotia to Lawrence Frederick McCabe and Mary Lillian (née: Coldwell) McCabe. He was married to Irene (née Ripley) McCabe. John was the second youngest of seven children - five boys and two girls.

At the age of 18, John enrolled for wartime military service in 1944 believing it was his duty to do what he could to try and save the country. He received his basic training in Cornwallis, Nova Scotia where he was assigned to Supplies Assistant. He also received three months basic training in Quebec City. Following basic training, John was then posted to "HMCS New Liskeard" which was a minesweeper. This ship was detailed to the St. Lawrence River, Halifax Harbour and Port aux Basque, Newfoundland. During the latter part of the war, John was posted to the "HMCS Albertan" which was dispatched to the mouth of the St. Lawrence River to trace a submarine (U190). The "HMCS Albertan" was an ocean-going tug.

It did not have any form of defence, just rifles. For this reason, the crew kept track of the vessel at a distance. During the war, the HMCS Albertan was to escort convoys across the ocean. If a ship was torpedoed, they could help by putting a line on the ship to help save the crew.

Later, John was transferred back to the minesweeper, HMCS New Liskeard. This ship did convoy-duty as well. This would have been close to the end of the war. John did not encounter any conflicts, nor did he see any injuries. The only thing that may have scared him somewhat was when the old 4.7 was fired off the bow of the ship. The whole ship shuttered as a result of the combustion. This was nerve wracking for some time.

An interesting and amusing story John recounted was as follows:

While tied up at Point Head Naval Base in North Sydney, John and his buddies (Jake Hamilton & Bub Terris) went into Sydney for the evening. Off to the side of the gate were two or three parked army jeeps. Sparky told John to keep the on-duty guard occupied while he went around back "to borrow" one of the jeeps. Sparky was able to start up one of the jeeps and the four of them piled in together. They started down the hill towards the wharf. This particular night was exceptionally foggy. The fog was so thick that it was difficult for Sparky to see where he was going. So, he stuck his head out the window in an effort to see better and when he did he lost his glasses.



He couldn't see anything after losing his glasses. Because he could not see, they went off the road and over a ditch onto another road. Just in this particular area, there were piles of huge steel floats stacked in pyramid shapes. These steel floats were used to hold up submarine nets. Each of these floats was about four feet in diameter – really quite large. Because Sparky was unable to see, the army jeep bumped the corner of one of these huge floats. Down came the steel pyramid! As soon as John and his buddies realized that these floats were coming down, they kept going in the jeep because they were ahead of them. The floats were like a steel wall right behind them. They went all over the place. They went into the water and everywhere. The boys made it safely back on board their ship. No one was the wiser as to how these floats had come down. Once the captain of their ship heard about the incident, he figured it must have been one of his crew who were responsible. The next morning at 0500 hours, they set sail.

John was discharged from duty in 1946 and returned to Truro, NS. He initially worked as a labourer with the town and then with Canadian National Railway (CNR). After taking a typing course, John worked in the Claims Department for CNR where he worked for 35 to 40 years. John enjoyed this work because it called for "the use of the noggin". He passed away at Camp Hill Veterans Hospital in Halifax on August 16, 2020.

# The Nova Scotia war dead of Groesbeek, the Netherlands.

### Editor's note:

Close to 175,000 Canadians took part in the campaign to liberate the Netherlands during the latter stages of WWII, which began in the fall of 1944 and ended in the spring of 1945.

In our 2020 edition, a list of war dead, buried in various Dutch cemeteries, was printed in honour of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the liberation of the Netherlands. The following is a continuation of the list of Nova Scotians who participated in the liberation and paid the supreme sacrifice. ### **The Groesbeek Memorial**

The Groesbeek Memorial commemorates, by name, those members of the Commonwealth land forces who died during the campaign in Northwest Europe between the time of crossing the Seine at the end of August 1944 and the end of the war in Europe. It contains 1,068 names of which 103 are Canadian. Seven of those war dead are from Nova Scotia.

### BLACK WATCH (ROYAL HIGHLAND REGIMENT) OF CANADA

**MacKINNON, GREGORY ALLAN**. Lance Corporal. 13/10/1944. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael MacKinnon of Glace Bay. Allan suffered a serious head wound and was taken prisoner by the Germans and died in a German army field hospital that same day.

### HIGHLAND LIGHT INFANTRY OF CANADA

**SKINNER, RALPH**. Private. 3/01/1945. Son of Abraham and Annie Skinner, of Sydney. Ralph was killed in action and reported dead by the Germans.

# ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION ARRAS BRANCH 59 MONUMENT MOVE

For over ten years Arras Branch 59 of the Royal Canadian Legion in Antigonish had hoped to have the local WW1 cenotaph moved (see cover photo). The location behind the Post Office in Chisholm Park had become too small to accommodate the increasing crowds that were attending the remembrance services. This area in town was also being used by many other groups throughout the year and the cenotaph was being encroached upon. Several years ago another major factor that intensified the need to find a more suitable home for the monument occurred. On the East end of Main St. the WW2 arch and memorial had to be taken down for safety reasons. The World War 2 plaques were therefore put into storage. Not being displayed meant that for several years Antigonish was not commemorating the soldiers from the area that had given their lives in that war.



Heritage is that which society inherits from previous generations and deems worthy of taking special measures to preserve for future generations. Shown is the WWII Arch.

A plan was put in place to find a new location to honour vets of both wars, and to have the WWI cenotaph moved there. A committee of volunteers considered various locations and after much research, settled on Columbus Field. Not only would it be large enough to accommodate a large cenotaph and the crowds of Remembrance Day, but it would also be very visible and accessible to all.

It took several meetings for the committee to choose the new design that had to then be sketched and presented to all parties (The Town of Antigonish, The County of Antigonish and the Columbus Club.) Once approved, the Legion had to set up working agreements, and set out the process for contracting out the work for the move and reconstruction of the cenotaph.

A detailed plan of the move and reconstruction was made and contractors were hired to build the new Cenotaph foundation in Columbus Field. The new foundation would allow the Cenotaph to be much higher and more visible from Main Street.

In the summer of 2020 the new foundation was poured and the work began on readying the WW1 cenotaph for the big move. The cenotaph needed to be cut from its base and cut in two! It would be too tall to move in one piece. Once these cuts were made the cenotaph was then craned onto a flatbed trailer and strapped in place. On September 15, 2020 the cenotaph moved down the road to its new location. Many were amazed to see the 30 ton stone monument in two pieces on its road trip!

Once it arrived safely at Columbus Field it was craned onto the new foundation. New matching sandstone was added to the concrete base along with steps. Over 1000 paver stones that were in Chisholm Park got moved and reinstalled as well. The World War 2 plaques were installed on the front of the new base. A new plaque was also installed on the front of the base to display names of both WW1 and WW2 soldiers that were missed on the original plaques. With much help from the Heritage Association of Antigonish all the biographies of the fallen soldiers from our area have been researched and written.

On Saturday October 24, 2020 a re-dedication service was held for our new monument, and on Nov 11<sup>th</sup> a scaled-down Remembrance Day service took place there.

Arras Branch 59 would like to thank all the many volunteers that helped make this project a reality. This huge and complex job is now complete and Antigonish and area now have the proper place to promote Remembrance.
