From sunrise to sunset on Sunday, April 9, the Legion will join federal, provincial and municipal institutions in lowering the Canadian flag to commemorate Vimy Ridge Day 2017. All other flags flown at all Legion locations, from branches across the country to Legion House in Ottawa, also will be lowered to half-mast in observance of this pivotal day in Canadian history.

Continuing the Legion tradition of Honouring and Remembering our military heritage is important to us all, and this day gives us an opportunity to come together nationally and locally to commemorate this momentous battle – the only one that has been memorialized by an Act of Parliament.
