NS/NU Command Executive Council Service Bureau Report

Our bureau is dealing with Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) disability applications, reviews/appeals and when requested assisting with Benevolent fund applications.

Since 1 Jan and as of 30 Apr 2020:

- we are handling 412 open/active VAC files (note 1)
- we made 2 home visits (note 2)
- we had 12 VAC disability claims withdrawn (note 3)
- we had 118 favorable and 9 unfavorable VAC disability claim decisions
- we have been responsible for approx. \$ 7.1 million dollars awarded. Which is the equivalent to financial lump sums for VAC disability claims including 4 new monthly pensions and/or increases. As important to these monetary pay-outs are the medical benefits given to each person for the rest of their life.

Note 1 - This includes Disability claims (first applications and departmental reviews), but also such things as Veterans Independence Program applications, Caregiver Recognition Benefit applications, Survivor applications, etc.

Note 2 - Complicated VAC cases which are Command clients who request to work on VAC forms in their home as they are not able to travel to our office due to mobility/medical issues. Also, weekly Veteran Farm Project deliveries between 11 Jul and 19 Sep 2019.

Note 3 - Claims are withdrawn for various reasons such as Veterans moving and not forwarding new contact information or Veterans not following through with their responsibilities in the process after an excess of a 5 months of assistance.

Since 1 Jan 202 our Bureau Service Officers participated in National Service Officer teleconferences. They had to postpone a meeting with representatives of the Veterans Review and Appeal Board and the Annual Service Officer Training in our Windsor Branch. They are scheduled to conduct Annual Service Officer Training on 13 June in our Baddeck branch and attend Bi-Annual Service Officer Professional Development from 26-30 Oct in Charlottetown PE.

On behalf of the Command Service Bureau, thanks to all the Branch Service Officers, Branch Executive and members for their dedication and determination through these unprecedented times. Also, to the Command Executive for their unwavering support, so we may remain functioning effectively through this Pandemic. The work of the Service Bureau would not be accomplished without all your assistance.

Executive Council May 2020

This is certainly been a trying time for our branches and members, and I hope that the second year of our term of office goes a little more smoothly. We will have a lot of branches in need of assistance when we open back up and we are going to have to work together to get them through.

Sub-Executive have been meeting by teleconference and more recently by Zoom on a weekly basis to go over the business of command on a timely matter. I cannot thank them enough for their guidance and engaged discussions to move this Command forward in a positive way.

As you can see from my DEC report, discussions, decisions, votes and changes were fast and furious and we worked our way through the Covid - 19 crisis and I want to thank you all for making sure all of this information was sent to branches to keep them informed as to the current status.

The Standardized By-Laws were completed and sent out to Executive Council, Zone Commanders, and branches for review. Hopefully, you have all had a look at them and sent in questions or comments to the committee for further review.

Valerie and I had a teleconference with Jessica Miller from the Veterans Farm Project and they are up and running for the 2020 season. They have more than doubled the food baskets for veterans' families this season and have plans to deliver Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets to these families as well. They delivered flowers at Easter to the veterans at the Camp Hill Hospital and more recently bouquets of tulips were delivered to celebrate the 75th Anniversary of the Liberation to the Netherlands.

I received messages of condolences from Grand President Comrade Larry Murray, DEC Chairman Bill Chafe and Command received messages from NB Command, and branches from BC/Yukon and NFLD/Lab on the devastating tragedy in Colchester Co. I passed along our regards for their thoughtful and kind words.

I signed the Book of Condolences on behalf of NS/NU Command as well as contacted both the Zone 10 Commander and District C Commander to express condolences and offer the support of NS/NU Command, Branches, and members. I also sent condolences to the RCMP Commissioner expressing our deepest sympathy to the RCMP family on the lost of Cst. Heidi Stevenson.

Two branches in our command have been set up as de-briefing stations for the RCMP and I would like to thank those branches for stepping up to assist. Branch 26 Colchester, Truro and Branch 160 Centennial, Dartmouth are to be commended for their generous support to the

RCMP. We should be proud that they came to the Legion to partner with them to support the members of the RCMP and the many others affected by the terrible lost in Colchester county.

I spoke to His Honour Arthur LeBlanc, the Lt. Governor of NS on May 6. He is one of our Patrons and he was genuinely concerned about how the branches are doing across our command during the pandemic, Colchester County tragedies and the recent lost of the 6 crew members of the Fredericton. We discussed our role within the communities, how we are affected by the closures and lack of the ability to fund raise to keep our branches viable. We talked about the many programs that Command and branches support to help our veterans, Veterans Farm Project, Operation VetBuild, and how our many Service Officers, both at Command and at each branch assist veterans and their families on a daily basis. He asked me to thank all the members of NS/NU command for all we do for our Veterans. The support we offer is a tremendous effort and we should be proud of the work we do.

I would like to thank our outstanding staff who have worked through this crisis to make ensure that our Veterans, branches, Executive Council, and members were always assisted. They have worked daily at Command headquarters, evening shifts, or at home, during the Office minimal manning procedures to keep us up to date with all information pertinent to the daily running of our Command. I would personally like to thank Comrade Valerie for her leadership in working with the staff to ensure they are ok, have the tools they need to do their job and to maintain the schedule keeping the office opened during this unprecedented times. He daily check ins, learning to support us all with Zoom and keep it all flowing is certainly a credit to her tremendous dedication to our Command and our Veterans.

NS/NU COMMAND EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

There have been several teleconferences since the last PEC meeting in February. March 13, a teleconference was held to discuss and vote on the cancellation of the following items: Dominion Command Members Sports, and all non-essential business travel by DEC. These items were carried unanimously. The DEC meeting was postponed from April 25-26, 2020 to June 3-4, 2020. Discussion of the postponement of the Saskatoon Convention 2020 will be reassessed in April.

Results of March 20, 2020 Teleconference.

Complaint Hearings

Situation: The GBLs do not specifically address Article III delays (other than GBL 307) or the postponement of complaint hearings. As branches are closed and operations cancelled, some in-progress complaint situations are left pending.

Decision: Effective immediately, all current and new complaints will be held in abeyance and GBL 308.d will be amended to remove the 45 day requirement.

Dominion Convention Resolution Deadline

Situation: The current due date for receipt of dominion convention resolutions at Dominion Command is 3 May. This provides time for review by the respective DC Committee and for the resolution to be included in the Convention Reports and Resolutions book, which must be printed and mailed to all branches 6 weeks prior to convention (GBL 919.e). Resolutions received at DC after the 3 May deadline are considered as late resolutions (GBL 919.d); those of a routine nature will be returned to Provincial Commands and urgent resolutions will be reviewed and considered. With branch closures, this 3 May deadline is now unmanageable for those branches that intended to submit resolutions.

Decision: The deadline date for submission of dominion convention resolutions remains unchanged, with all resolutions received after that date considered as late resolutions. HOWEVER, all late resolutions will receive consideration at the pre-convention DEC meeting and none will be returned in advance of that meeting for being routine.

Branch Elections

Situation: Branch elections are often held in the spring, with the new executive taking office in early summer. Branch closures have impacted the branch election process.

Decision: Branch elections and transitions to a new executive, and branch by-laws / regulations pertaining to branch elections, are suspended pending a return to normal branch operations.

Note: As Districts and Zones are administrative units of a Command, any change to elections at those levels will be the decision of the respective Provincial Command.

Go Fund Me Pages

Situation: Some branches have started Go Fund Me pages to raise funds to help pay bills during the period of branch closure caused by the COVID-19 outbreak. This type of online fundraising is in conflict with section 129 of the GBLs, which places geographical limitations on where branches can appeal for financial assistance. Decision: Section 129 of the GBLs is rescinded in its entirely effective immediately and until further notice.

With this action, Branch Go Fund Me pages are no longer in conflict with the GBLs and can proceed. Make sure to list the branch # not just the word legion as these funds are specific to each branch.

Dominion Command Funding

April 2, 2020 teleconference was held, and approval was given to release up to \$3 million dollars to support branches. The first allotment was sent to Provincial/Territorial Commands to distribute. This was received by NS/NU Command and distributed April 28, 2020.

Dominion Command Track and Field

On April 3, 2020, the Dominion Command Track and Field was officially cancelled for 2020.

On April 15, DEC was informed that the scheduled June 4-5 meeting will be held via Zoom and the following was approved by DEC:

April 16, 2020 Teleconference Dominion Convention

The 2020 dominion convention from this August to 12-19 August 2021. Not only was DEC approval needed but this action required the unanimous approval of all Provincial Commands, which was given.

Impact on the organization:

Elections: All Dominion Senior Elected Officers will remain in their elected positions for another year. **Resolutions:** Most provincial commands submitted resolutions for consideration at convention. These will be held for consideration at the 2021 dominion convention unless they deal with issues that are already in progress with the respective DC committee or are of a nature that DEC must consider before then

Future Conventions: The 2022 dominion convention scheduled for 20-25 August 2022 in Saint John, NB is also rescheduled, to August 2024. This will put us back on our 2-year rotation for dominion conventions taking place in even-numbered years (2024, 2026, etc).

Provincial Conventions: This decision will impact provincial conventions, as they are scheduled for 2021. The decision to proceed or reschedule a provincial convention, in light of this action, is a consideration for your command to determine how best to proceed.

Next DEC Zoom /Teleconference will be held on May 12 or 13th and I will give a verbal report on this meeting.

All other matters will be appropriately reported through Committee Chairman.
